# May Speaker Scott McGregor

"Growing Orchids in the Southern California Coastal Climate"

Scott McGregor has been growing orchids since he was 12, when a neighbor gave him a plant. That plant had a short life, but the hook was set, and he found books and sources for orchid species while growing up in St. Louis.

His collection has morphed over time, living in different location around the world, but has always centered around the more unusual species. Scott grows all his plants outdoors, without a greenhouse, just "subtracting some sunlight and adding some water" to what nature provides in Southern California.


He especially enjoys finding new species that grow well in our cli-

mate (many are far more adaptable than most people would believe), and now grows over 500 different orchid species, along with cloud forest companion plants such as Heliamphora and epiphytic Utricularia.

Scott rarely uses chemical insecticides or fungicides, preferring fresh air, beneficial insects and our na-

tive tree frogs. Scott retired from the corporate world a few years ago, and stays active on corporate boards and working with non-profit groups that promote science education for kids. He resides with his family in San Juan Capistrano, California.

## Topic

Don't have a greenhouse? No problem, we live in a very orchid friendly climate. This talk describes the journey experimenting with hundreds of species in our Southern California coastal climate to find what grows well.

Surprisingly, many species listed as "warm growers" or "greenhouse" actually do just fine outdoors, so if you don't have a greenhouse, here are some you can try. If you do have a greenhouse, you can free up some space by booting some outdoors, where they may be happier anyway.


