"Papua New Guinea: A Wonderland of Orchids, Birds and Cultures"

Mary Gerritsen, Ph.D., is an independent biotechnology consultant who has been growing orchids (mostly species) on and off for more than 30 years.

Since relocating to the San Francisco Bay area in 1997, Mary has started a collection of small, cool growing miniature species such as Masdevallias, Porroglossums, Lepanthes and other assorted tiny gems. She also has a second, intermediate greenhouse, filled with larger species such as Angraecoids, Dendrobiums, Oncidiums, Laelias, Phalaenopsis and Bulbophyllums.

She loves to see orchids growing *in situ* and has made it her mission over the last few years to see as many as possible, with trips to see and photo-

Mary frequently lectures at orchid societies in the San Francisco Bay area, and on occasion, nearby in Southern California, Oregon, Nevada, Arizona and sometimes even further afield in Missouri, Kansas, and Canada.

She is on the board of directors of the *Orchid Digest*, the chief operating officer and treasurer of the Orchid Conservation Alliance, and is also a member of the American Orchid Society, the San Francisco Orchid Society, the Peninsula Orchid Society and the Pleurothallid Alliance.

Holiday Party 2021: Change It Up!


This year our Holiday Party will be a little different (like everything else in the last year and a half).

Cultivation of Cattleya eldorado

Cultivation

- Temperature: Warm to hot year-round
- Humidity: High, with good air movement
- Light: Medium to bright
- Watering: Regularly, with less drying than most Cattleya species, especially during periods of active growth
- Fertilizer: Regular during growth periods



- Prefer clay pots
- Potting medium must be open
- Grows better hanging air movement
- Repot regularly (moist conditions promote decay of potting medium)
- Brittle roots
