Merle Robboy

"A Sensate Visit to Guatemala"

According to Webster's dictionary, the meaning of *sensate* is "relating to through the senses." This month Dr. Merle Robboy will take us on a trip to Guatemala to learn about the country and the orchids that are found there.

This will not be the usual type of presentation. Our senses will be awed by the beauty of both countryside and flowers, in addition to Merle's original poetry!

We are fortunate to have Merle as a member of our society. His knowledge and experience is a great resource for all our members. Merle is not only well-known within our own society, but he is a noted hobbyist known throughout Southern California!

A practicing gynecologist, Dr. Robboy is known in the Southern California orchid community both as an orchid lecturer for the American Orchid Society (AOS) and for his encyclopedic knowledge of orchids. A former president of NHOS and the Southern California Species Society, Dr. Robboy has been growing orchids for over forty years.

His extensive orchid collection comprises approximately 1500 plants and reflects his strong interest in orchid species. He has traveled and viewed orchids in the wild in Central and South America. In addition to orchids, Dr. Robboy has a wide interest in other tropical plant types and serves as a judge in the American Dahlia Society.

The National Flower of Guatemala, "Monja Blanca"

The "Monja Blanca" or White Nun Orchid (*Lycaste skinneri Var. alba*) was designated the national flower of Guatemala by General Jorge I on February 11, 1934. The white flower symbolizes beauty, peace, and art.

When the Monja Blanca was designated the national flower, everyone wanted one and the flower soon became very rare in the wild. Although there are a few places outside of Guatemala where it has been commercialized, it is not allowed to be cut or commercialized in Guatemala itself.
