Donna Ballard

"The Difference between Seedlings, Meristem Clones and Stem Propagated Orchids."

Donna Ballard was born, raised and went to school in the San Fernando Valley. She is now an Accredited American Orchid Society Judge.

After over 30 years of loving, tending, and studying plants, she went on to work as a professional interior house plant technician until four years ago. So she comes to orchid growing with a horticultural background and many years of experience.

Currently a volunteer at the Huntington Botanical gardens Thornton Estate Orchid Conservatory in San Marino, she is also 1st Vice President of the San Fernando Valley Orchid Society, an active member of the Orchid Society of Southern California, on the AOS Board of Education, and Co-Chair of the new AOS.

Donna currently has approximately 1300 orchids and 460 square feet of both greenhouse, shade house and interior



growing areas, where she grows Cattleyas, Paphiopedilums, Cymbidiums, Dendrobiums, Sarcochilas, miniature Vanda and Phalaenopsis orchids, as well as several other genera.

The presentation she will be giving is called "The Difference between Seedlings, Meristem Clones and Stem Propagated Orchids." She will give a demonstration on flasking and unflasking seedlings at the end of her talk.
